Salma's Story

Mrs. Salma Begum, age 30 years, from the village of Algi was admitted into the LHCB Hospital in February, 2012 with serious complications. She had delivered her baby by caesarean section in a private clinic in Patuakhali one and a half months prior. After delivery she developed a wound infection which spread to her blood, and she was not responding to the care she was receiving.

Her family decided to bring her to our hospital where she was properly diagnosed by Dr. Uttam. She received preoperative antibiotics and was taken to the operating room where her wound was opened and properly drained, and she was fully cured from her wound and blood infection. If this treatment was not done immediately, she would have died from the complications of infection.

Mrs. Begum and her family are grateful to LHCB and to the donors who support the hospital and doctors in Dumki.

Work of LHCB in 2011

- 11,300 total patients served, including over 1300 inpatients
- 480 babies born at the LHCB hospital
- 2,200 life-saving immunizations administered
- 50 Traditional Birth Attendants (midwives) received refresher training
